4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Boone County 4-H is proud to hosts various free youth clubs and programs such as Livestock Club, Roller Skate Club, Teen Club, and more. These programs help school-aged youth learn vital skills through a "learn-by-doing" approach. We host an annual summer camp at North Central 4-H Camp and participate in the Boone County 4-H Utopia and Fair. Our 4-H new enrollment year begins September 1st, 2023, come be a part of 4-H!

AGRICULTURE

We strive to make a difference in agriculture on farms across the Commonwealth through our various programs such as County Agriculture Investment Program (CAIP) and the Boone County Farmers Market. Operated by the Boone County Farmers Market Association, our products are grown exclusively in Northern Kentucky.

COMMUNITY ARTS

Community Arts is our newest department, deriving from Community and Economic Initiative of Kentucky (CEDIK) in an effort to engage residents with quality arts experiences, develop artistic skills, and support community and economic development through the arts. Program offerings include using art for wellness, the benefits of storytelling through creative writing, and an open studiostyle art circle for community members. We also have a dye garden at the Boone County Nature Center Demonstration Gardens, where we grow a variety of traditional plants used for natural dyes, allowing us to explore safer and more sustainable art processes.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

Environmental education allows individuals to develop a deeper understanding of environmental issues in their community. Through research-based information, we offer a variety of programs at our Boone County Environmental and Nature Center. This year we hosted our first Kentucky Master Naturalist cohort. In the fall, we will host several Environmental camps.

FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCES

Our Family and Consumer Sciences professionals help individuals manage their money, care for their loved ones, improve their knowledge of nutrition, and more. We are proud to support the Boone County Extension Homemakers Association, a group of volunteers who are interested in life-long learning and sharing their time and talents with the county. We also are home to Boone County's Nurtition Education Program, which encompasses two USDA programs: EFNEP and SNAP-Ed. Nurition Education targets low income families with the goal to promote healthy lifestyles.

HORTICULTURE

Our horticulture department provides information on invasive plant species, plant identification, and soil samples. We show individuals tips to apply to their own gardens. We offer educational programs at our Boone County Nature Center Demonstration Gardens. From strawbale gardening to growing a champion pumpkin, we meet the horticultural needs of the county. We participate in the Kentucky Extension Master Gardener program where volunteers learn about botany, tree-identification, propagation, & more.

Learn about eco-printing, a natural dye process that leaves an imprint of botanical color & shapes on fabric through steaming. Over two days, we'll learn about natural dyes, prepare our fabric bundles for steaming, and spend time in the dye garden (weather permitting). At the end, we'll unveil our wearable works of art. **Must attend both days**.

Botanical Wall Hanging






