How do I get my 4-H projects back?

If you did not pick your project up from the fairgrounds on June 29, your project will be transported to the Extension Office and available for pickup beginning Tuesday, July 1st. Items not picked up by July 11th will be discarded.

How do I collect my prize premiums?

Entries awarded first, second, or third place will receive prize money. If you earned prize money and did not pick up your check on Sunday, June 29th at the fairgrounds, checks may be collected at the Extension Office beginning Tuesday, July 1. Checks are only valid for 90 days so be sure to pick them up before September 25, 2025. Expired checks will not be reissued.

When will I get my State Fair items back?

State Fair projects will be available for pick up at the Extension Office on Tuesday, August 26. Hours are 8:00 AM - 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Items not picked up by September 30 will be discarded.

KID APPROVED RECIPE

Banana Split Breakfast Bowl

Ingredients:

- 2 medium bananas, peeled and sliced lengthwise
- 1/2 cup low-fat vanilla yogurt, divided
- 1/2 cup diced or sliced strawberries, divided
- 1/2 cup pineapple tidbits-drained, divided
- 4 tablespoons granola, divided
- 2 tablespoons of nuts (optional)
- 6 blueberries, raspberries, blackberries or cherries (optional)


Directions:

- 1. Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Place one banana in bottom of small bowl.
- 3. Spread half of the yogurt on top of split banana.
- 4. Add half of the strawberries and pineapple tidbits.
- 5. Top with half of the granola, nuts and berries.
- Repeat with other banana half and remaining toppings.

- 7. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.


Sharpshooters


